Supermajority Vote for State Taxes or Fees; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to prohibit a state tax or fee from being imposed or raised except through legislation approved by two-thirds of each house of legislature; requires a state tax or fee imposed or raised to be contained in separate bill that contains no other subject.

Redirection of Fees to Tax Collectors; Provides for allocation of fees from certain driver license examinations administered by tax collectors & certain driver license reinstatement services performed by tax collectors. Effective Date: July 1, 2018

HB 27 by Fitzenhagen (Identical SB 1492, Compare HB 597, SB 622)

Certificates of Need for Hospitals; Eliminates certificates of need for hospitals; provides licensure requirements. Effective Date: July 1, 2018

HB 37 by Burgess, Miller, M., Magar, Payne, Stevenson, White (Similar CS/SB 80)

Direct Primary Care Agreements; Specifies that direct primary care agreement does not constitute insurance & provides requirements for such agreement. Effective Date: July 1, 2018

HB 517 by Magar (Similar SB 954)

State Employees' Prescription Drug Program; Requires DMS to implement formulary management cost-saving measures; provides requirements for such measures; removes provision that prohibits department from implementing restricted prescription drug formulary or prior authorization program in state employees' prescription drug program. Effective Date: July 1, 2018

Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable; Appropriations Committee: Favorable

HB 57 by White, Williams, Geller, Killebrew (Identical SB 146)
